There's a great deal of buzz about the upcoming production of the controversial play "Lord of the Flies" and UPC has tickets! The UPC theater outing is at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, September 11. The Cardinal Stage Company is producing the show at the Buskirk Chumley Theater.

Cardinal founder and award winning producer Randy White is directing a cast of professional and age appropriate actors. Because of the play's intensity, it will only run for five

performances. Cardinal gave UPC an excellent discount. We'll be in the first six rows, center section, for \$18.50 per ticket instead of the usual \$23.50.

The novel Lord of the Flies tells the highly controversial story of stranded schoolboys who rule an island paradise. Nobel Prize-winning William Golding's acclaimed book is now a shocking dramatization of the good and evil within us all.

UPC's Tuesday Evening Book & Bible Study has been studying *Lord of the Flies* each Tuesday evening since July 30th to prepare for attending the play. The study will continue through Tuesday September 10.

To reserve and pay for tickets to attend the show, see UPC event coordinator Allen Pease during fellowship hour or in the church office during office hours. 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# **Pulpit Supply Introduction**

Reaching U.P. will be providing the monthly schedule for the individuals that will be leading the worship service and providing the sermon. Each month, there will also be a highlight of one or two of these individuals. This month Reaching U.P. highlights Reverend Sarah Cochran.

#### Introduction to Reverend Sarah Cochran

Sarah is not a stranger to UPC. Her mother, Ruth was a long time member at UPC and Sarah became a member in 2001. She has been active since that time, serving as a ruling elder, as a communicant class teacher, and has occasionally preached. She was absent for approximately 6 years while she served a congregation both before and after her ordination in 2009.

Sarah Cochran was born into a Presbyterian family in Brooklyn, NY in 1946. She went to Hanover College and McCormick Theological Seminary. She received her Master of Divinity from McCormick in 1972, 20 years after starting kindergarten in Bismarck, North Dakota.

Unable to find employment in the church, she primarily worked in social services, as well as many "regular" jobs such as McDonalds, in the Purdue Student Union as a maid and at Noble Romans as a server. In 2001, she became a member of UPC and once again formally pursued ordination. UPC was the congregation who sponsored her in the Presbytery of Ohio Valley. 37 years after graduating from seminary, on August 16, 2009, she was ordained to the ministry of Word and Sacrament in the UPUSA. That service took place at UPC and the place ROCKED.


Prior to her ordination for 2 1/2 years and following for about 4 years she served the congregation in Vernon, Indiana. She currently is looking for another position in which to serve the church as a teaching elder. Until that happens she is happy to once again be active in the UPC fellowship.
