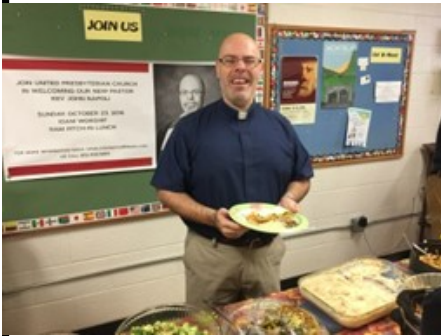

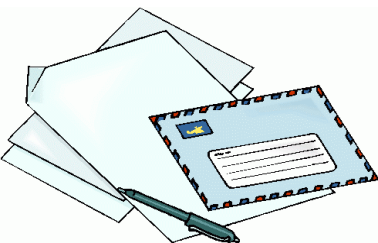

April was another month where expenses exceeded income. We took in \$7,303.50 and our expenses were \$12,609.26 giving us a net cash flow of negative \$5,305.76 for April. Our net cash flow for the year to date is in the red for the first time at negative \$1,410.69.

It's that time of year again, when we ask those who are able to pay their per-capita. The amount for 2018 is \$36 per member.

A number of you have reached out about the proposed rezoning of 1924 E. 2nd St. ENA residents who live adjacent to the property received notice that the owners of the property have petitioned to split the property into a two-lot subdivision, each zoned for single-family residential. The new owners of the property are Bob and Kari Costello, who own Soma, Laughing Planet Cafe, and Village Deli.

Some neighbors have questions about the rezoning, and others are concerned . . . I encourage you to attend the City meeting to consider the proposal on June 11 at 4pm in room #155 at City Hall. The final determination is scheduled for July 9, 4pm in the same place.

Dear Resident(s),

I live at 705 S. Clifton Ave. You have probably received a notice from the City about the petition to subdivide the lot at 1924 E. 2nd street. The plan involved dividing the lot in half and building a second house with a planned driveway exiting onto Anita. Some residents have expressed concerns ranging from: increased traffic on Anita, increased load on an already ill-equipped and poorly maintained city infrastructure, lack of precedent in this neighborhood for this kind of lot division, increased housing density, loss of mature trees and greenspace, landlords without neighborhood investment.
