

The flower sale raised \$302 to benefit youth activities.



Ancestry.com adds more Presbyterian Church records for Indiana

Indiana Genealogical Society reported in their newsletter that Ancestry.com had updated their database, U.S. **Presbyterian Church Records, 1701-1970**, which included Presbyterian Church records from parts of 38 states, including Indiana. That database has been updated further, so that its Indiana coverage now consists of most counties including Monroe County (Bloomington).

NOTE: A subscription is required to access this database but you can access free at the Indiana University Bloomington Libraries (ask for guest account if you are not an IU affiliate) and also at the Monroe County History Center (Tuesday through Saturday 10-4p.m.).

□ UPC Music Program Update □

After four wonderful years with United Presbyterian, Dr. Sarah Moon Stamey has resigned to take a position at another church. As we sadly bid fond farewell and best wishes to Dr. Stamey, the Worship Team reports that they have launched a search for UPC's Music Director.

The Worship Team has appointed a Search Team with a goal of having a replacement by mid-August. Search Team members are Alejandra Haddad, Souheil Haddad, Sue Lorimer, Allen Pease and Stephanie Worden. Reverend John Napoli is serving as the adviser.

The Team, with Dr. Stamey's assistance, created a Music Director job description which has been posted with Jacobs School of Music, Bloomington Symphony Orchestra, Presbytery of Ohio Valley and several area churches. The job description follows. Friends and members of UPC are encouraged to pass it along to those who they feel may be interested or know of others who may be interested.

Music Director Position

United Presbyterian Church of Bloomington (UPC) is seeking a Music Director to become an integral part of a small, loving and diverse congregation within walking distance of the Jacobs School of Music.

The Music Director is an important ministry as it relates to United Presbyterian's worship, fellowship and growth. The purpose of the UPC Music Director position is to facilitate an atmosphere in which God is worshipped and glorified and to contribute to the music ministry of the Church by playing the piano/organ, directing the choir, coordinating the guest artist program and student singer program for worship services, and overseeing maintenance of the church's instruments.

A bachelor's degree in keyboard performance, choral conducting, music education or equivalent experience in a Christian church is preferred. The candidate must be proficient in both organ and piano and should have some vocal or choir experience. A basic understanding of how religious music is utilized and performed in a church setting is required. Candidate must be available for 10:00 AM Sunday morning services and Tuesday evening services during Lent and Advent as well as for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Christmas Eve services The Music Director will work closely and cooperatively with the UPC Worship Team and the pastor to select all aspects of the music for each of these services. The Music Director duties include accompanying those guest artists who require an accompanist. The UPC Chancel Choir performs from mid-September through the end of May, approximately 30-32 Sundays per year. During the UPC Chancel Choir's performance season, the Music Director will schedule one rehearsal each week not to exceed one hour in length.

The instruments available are an Allen electronic organ and a Broadman grand piano.

Time expectation for this position is approximately 5-10 hours per week. Salary is \$9,500 per year and will be paid monthly.


Youth in Action (everyone is invited to join)



Rated PG13 for strong language, some violence.

July 31 — The Martian

Starring Matt Damon

During a mission to Mars, an astronaut is presumed dead after a fierce storm and left behind. But he's survived and finds himself stranded and alone on the hostile planet. With meager supplies, he must draw upon his ingenuity, wit and spirit to subsist and find a way to signal Earth that he is alive. Rated PG13 for strong language, some nudity.

Pastor will host and lead discussion on a deeper meaning that could be interpreted, relationships depicted, underlying story lines or what is going on that we are not seeing. These are not religious themed movies but every day hits that he finds meaningful. Free fresh popcorn and snacks served.
