Youth in Action (and everyone is invited to join)



Financial Report

January was a very good month. Our income was \$26,520.50 and expenses were \$11,934.02 giving us a net cash flow of \$14,586.48 for the month. This puts us in a good position starting the year off. However, the unusually large income is due to a few donors who make a lump sum donation at the beginning of the year, so this is not indicative of what the coming months will look like. It is important that everyone keep up their giving so we can avoid having to draw from our investments to meet day to day expenses.
