

In February, we spent down much of the funds built up in January. Our income was \$5,632.97 and expenses were \$13,885.45 giving us a net cash flow of negative \$8,252.48 for the month and \$6,334.00 for the year-to-date. The Souper Bowl collection netted \$259.47. 
Doctoral chamber music recital
