December income was \$14,187, which is good, but expenses were \$17,152 giving us a deficit of \$2,965 for December. The good news is that, for the year as a whole, our giving significantly outpaced expenses. We ended 2020 with a surplus of \$14,582. Expenses were lower with the building being closed for much of the year and giving was up, allowing us to survive well financially in an otherwise very challenging year.
