The program will consist of Bach's English Suite in G Minor BWV 808, Mozart's Sonata in D Major K. 311, and a set of opera transcriptions by Franz Liszt, including the famous "Liebestod" from Tristan und Isolde. The recital will run a little over an hour, and all are invited!

Merrill Hall is located at 1201 E Third Street. Within Merrill Hall is IU's most historic performance space, Recital Hall, which hosted its first performance on January 15, 1937. World-renowned musicians have performed in this 500-seat hall for more than 70 years. There is no charge for admission.


