

April 1, 2023 Dear Family in Christ

Please join me in prayer for the communities of Sullivan and Martinsville; both sustained tornado damage last night (March 31)

First, here is news about **Sullivan**, where the **Rev. Dawn Black** serves as pastor of First Presbyterian Church. While the church building was not damaged, one hundred fifty homes in town and another fifty in the county were destroyed as a (preliminary) EF-4 tornado swept through the area. Peak winds were 155 miles per hour during the storm that traveled 8.94 miles. There are three confirmed fatalities and at least 300 displaced residents. Dawn reports, "*Two of the homes destroyed are part of my church family. There are church members we have not been able to contact and we are desperately seeking prayers for them and their families.*"

We will know more about how to be of help in the weeks and months to come. *For now, please do not attempt to travel to Sullivan, as power lines are down and rescue works are still at work.*



In **Martinsville**, an EF0 tornado with wind gusts of up to 85 miles per hour traveled through the area. The **Rev. John Erickson** serves as pastor of First Presbyterian Church, which sustained considerable damage, ripping the steeple from the building and sending debris into the sanctuary. I was able to visit with John today and took these photos:

The congregation will worship in the fellowship hall on Sunday. Please be in prayer for them as they navigate their way through the pain and grief that accompany such dam-

age. We will also be in touch with you as we learn how else to be of help. I have contacted Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), and a National Response Team is being deployed. I will meet with the leaders of that team Wednesday through Friday to tour the affected areas, offer support to pastors and people, and work on next steps. Monetary support is always helpful at times like this, as it can quickly be sent to where it is most needed. Reverend Montgomery Reception Joyous Event!


The UPC Worship Team invites all to a Welcome Reverend Cheryl Montgomery Reception immediately after the May 7 Sunday worship service.


