MAY/JUNE FINANCIAL REPORT

Expenses exceeded income in both May and June. Total expenses for the two months were \$23,530 compared to total income of \$20,867 giving a deficit of \$2,663. We are still on the positive side for the year-to-date, but only by \$645. Because income has been down, compared to past years, we have resumed the pre-Covid practice of passing the collection plate rather than just leaving it in the Narthex. Hopefully, this will ensure that people don't forget the giving part of worship. Pastor's compensation is again part of our monthly expenses, so it is important that everyone keep up their giving.

Cecilia Ann Schuman, formerly of Hobart, Indiana, passed away on May 17, 2023, at the age of



83. She died peacefully at IU Health Hospice House in Bloomington, Indiana surrounded by her children.

Schuman was the oldest of four children born to Ruth Elizabeth (Liberko) and Elton George Going. She grew up in Glen Carbon, Illinois, graduated from Edwards-
