We are currently working through a strategic planning process with the primary goal to increase membership over the next years. To that end we have been working to transform our outdoor worship space into a something suitable for worship, weddings, concerts, and other events that will make Unity a place the congregation and community can renew and revitalize their mind, body and spirit in the midst of creation.

Guided by our Earth Care Congregation principles we are also working to revitalize the property by removing invasive plants and planting a biblically inspired garden. One of the issues we have is an original house on our property is old, becoming dangerous, and needs to removed, this is of course costly so prayers that Unity can source the funding to take on this project without putting undue stress on the congregation's budget would be appreciated. Along with this transformation a new ministry tied to our food pantry is about to be born. We are almost ready to launch a small orchard project that will plant up to 40 fruit trees, apples and pears, on our property that will be able to provide fresh fruit for not only our food pantry but all the food pantries in the Terre Haute area in the next 3-5 years. Prayers for the successful beginnings and growth of this mission and ministry are greatly desired.

The congregation at Unity is dreaming big about what comes next and invites you to pray with them for what may come next, what God may leading us to do in this exciting time of transition: an open air pavilion, a labyrinth, a wheel chair accessible playground, solar power for the church, among other wonderful ideas have been shared so we welcome prayers of discernment for our vision team and our session as they hear the Spirit and lead us to follow the goals of our strategic plan.
