**Wednesday — July 9 Meet Me in St. Louis!**

A 1944 MGM musical divided into a series of seasonal vignettes, starting with Summer 1903, it relates the story of a year in the life of the Smith family in St. Louis leading up to the opening of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition (commonly referred to as the World's Fair) in the spring of 1904. It stars Judy Garland and Margaret O'Brien. The music is wonderful. It was both a critical and a commercial success — the second-highest-grossing film of 1944 and MGM's most successful musical of the 1940s. In 1994, it was deemed "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant" by the Library of Congress and selected for preservation in the United States National Film Registry.

**Wednesday — July 16 The Last Rodeo**

A one-time rodeo world champion and military veteran risks it all as he deals with his faith, relationship with his adult daughter and his grandchild's illness in this film released earlier this year. He proves that true courage is found in the fight for family. It was released earlier this year by Angel Films. The film was produced by Angel Studios.

**Wednesday — July 23 One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest**

A 1975 psychological comedy-drama film based on the 1962 novel. It stars [Jack Nicholson](#) as a new patient at a mental institution and Louise Fletcher as the domineering head nurse. It won five Academy Awards — Best Movie, Best Actor, Best Actress, Best Director & Best Screen Play — one of only three films to achieve that in Academy Awards history. In 1993, it was deemed "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant" by the United States Library of Congress, and selected for preservation in the National Film Registry.



NOTE: The film has a very powerful message as well as strong language. Not recommended for those 16 and under.
